

Important notes for Camp Application 2022 – please read thoroughly!

1. Applications will be accepted from Wednesday 23rd February 2022
 2. Please do not email entries, accepting postal entries only
 3. **The ballot date for entries is Wednesday 16th March 2022.** All applications will have equal opportunity to be allocated a space. Where there is an over subscription, a blind ballot will be used to allocate spaces. Thereafter, a waiting list will be operated and spaces confirmed as they become available
 4. Please post application forms with cheques made payable to **Area 22** (not Jacqui McAdam), please include additional stabling in your fee. Any additional food, please make separate cheque for this amount
 5. All cheques will be banked upon acceptance but you will be advised prior to this. Bank details will be confirmed should you wish to pay direct into the Area 22 BRC account
 6. No application will be accepted without full payment
 7. No application will be accepted without the current 2022 application form and Flu Vaccination/EHV-1 declaration form completed
 8. No application will be accepted without a valid, current membership no from an Area 22 affiliated riding club. Please check your club is affiliated before applying
 9. Only 1 horse per person, per application allowed. No one other than the named rider/camp attendee may ride the named horse
 10. Minimum age of rider 18. Minimum age of horse 4
 11. All horses must remain stabled onsite for the duration of camp
 12. No horse may be left unattended, there are plenty of people to keep an eye on them if you need to leave site for any reason, please ensure you organise cover prior to leaving site and inform the Stable Manager
 13. No horse may be left tied up outside the stable unattended
 14. Lessons are made up of groups dependent on level so please ensure that you are accurate with your skill level. Please provide information on current level of activity for you and the horse on the application. This information is essential to ensure you are placed in groups with others at the same level
 15. X country is dangerous, please ensure that you are competent and secure prior to selecting these sessions. In the event that your instructor does not deem you secure / competent to ride X country you may be asked to leave the session in which case we will find an alternative session for you to join which may be more suitable. Body protectors and correct skull caps must be worn during XC lessons
 16. **All horses attending camp must have an up to date flu vaccination record in accordance with BRC rules. It is your responsibility to ensure that your horse is up to date with their vaccinations. Upon arrival, your horse's passport will be checked and if it is not up to date you will be asked to leave. No refunds will be given as it is your responsibility to ensure your horse is fully vaccinated to attend camp. A Flu Vaccination/EV-1 declaration is included in the camp application process, please ensure you read, sign and return this with your entry form.**
 17. Stables must be fully cleared out, normally 2 metres from the stable door. Your passport will not be returned to you until your stable has been checked
- **Please note that there is a limited number of sleeping pods available in the bunkhouse. I will confirm how many, the cost and take names once camp spaces are confirmed**
